Peer Innovation Breakouts

Session Title	Session Description
1A: Diving Deeper on Leveraging Policies to improve outcomes	This session will dive deeper into “levels of leverage” in maternal health policy work, allowing participants to brainstorm together and with the session facilitators about where they might see early wins, build on COVID responses and leverage policies over time.
1B: Telehealth 101	Peer discussion for participants who are now working to launch telehealth initiatives, focused on initial successes, challenges and resources needed.
1C: Engagement & Equity as a Two-Way Street (Repeated in 3B)	This session will provide foundational information and discussion about engagement and equity. The Intercultural Development Inventory tool will be introduced as a resource for internal learning about an organization’s intercultural capacity.
1D: Late Breaking Topic: What’s Working in the Time of Covid-19: Convening, Budgeting, Managing, Surviving!	The topics for this session will be decided by current issues at the time of the session and preferences of the session participants.
1E: Engagement with American Indian Communities	This peer discussion will include current approaches for effective engagement in American Indian communities.
1F: Risk Appropriate Care: Developing Triage Indices	This peer discussion will center on how projects are currently developing or supporting triage indices and risk-appropriate care in their work.
2A: Using Data to Drive Decision-Making - Deep Dive	This session will immediately follow the Learning Session on RBA, allowing participants to consider how they might use RBA in their own work, brainstorm with the facilitator and one another about how this tool might be useful in their own context.
2B: State MHI Indicators: Measurement for the Overall Initiative	This session will provide an opportunity to learn more about shared MHI indicators and give feedback into the measurement process. Please ensure at least one person from each MHI team attends this session.
2C: Telehealth 201	Peer discussion for participants working to expand existing telehealth initiatives, focused on initial successes, challenges and resources needed. Included here would be initiatives such as tele-mentoring, breastfeeding support, mental health supports and leveraging COVID-19 telehealth policies to either advance or scale up services.
2D: Remote Health Monitoring Strategies	This session will provide space for participants to discuss remote monitoring strategies (blood pressure, blood sugar, fetal monitoring, etc.) in their own state/region and how current MHI and RMOMS action plans might be adapted to include this work. Also, discussion of implications for care, policy, & reimbursement.
2E: Engagement of Consumers & Community Members on Project Teams, Task Forces & other Maternal Health	This discussion will provide space for participants to describe their current approaches to effective consumer and community-level engagement in their planned or current maternal health activities.
2F: Living in a Virtual World: Engagement, Technology & Momentum	This session will allow participants to describe successes and strategies for effective virtual engagement, technology and sustaining momentum when in-person meetings are not possible.

2G: Medicaid Policies that Support Maternal Health Improvements	This session will provide space for discussion of relevant Medicaid policies that participants have leveraged (or are considering) to advance maternal health outcomes. Examples might include doula support and/or community-based health worker support.
3A: Diving Deeper on Implementation Science	This session will allow for expanded discussion and examples of how implementation stages, drivers and teams can be used to move work forward with intention.
3B: Engagement & Equity as a Two-Way Street (Repeat of 1C)	This session will provide foundational information and discussion about engagement and equity. The Intercultural Development Inventory tool will be introduced as a resource for internal learning about an organization's intercultural capacity.
3C: RMOMS PIMS Measures: Measurement for the Overall Initiative	This session will provide an opportunity to learn more about the RMOMS Performance Improvement and Measurement Systems (PIMS) indicators and evaluation activities. Please ensure at least one person from each RMOMS team attends this session.
3D: Planning for Success	This session will allow participants to learn with and from their peers about their approaches to planning, including how plans have been adapted to be phased, iterative, informed by data/feedback, and responsive to environmental factors (e.g. responses to COVID-19).
3E: Maternal Health Workforce Issues	This peer discussion will describe current challenges and opportunities to address current workforce shortages, including the role of current projects in preparing new professionals for engagement in maternal health work (both clinical and public health).
3F: Levels of Maternal Care	This peer session will focus on discussion about how participants are using or considering use of the 2019 Obstetric Care Consensus on Levels of Maternal Care (LoMC) , which was released by ACOG and SMFM to update guidance to better prepare hospitals to provide risk-appropriate maternal care.
3G: Engagement with Rural & Frontier Communities	This peer discussion will include current approaches for effective engagement in rural and frontier communities.
